Geography is the study of distributions, patterns, and movements across space, both physical and social. Human geographers study the geographic patterns of various human activities: economic, political, and cultural. Physical geographers focus on the geography of physical processes and their effects: the geography of weather and climate. At Ohio State students choose from five specializations: Environment and Society; Urban, Regional, and Global Studies; Climatic Studies; Physical Geography; and Spatial Analysis.<sup>i</sup>
