The Hebrew major is offered by the Department of Near Eastern Languages and Cultures and includes courses in language, culture, literature, and linguistics. The rich body of Hebrew literature is first studied in English translation; as students' progress in the major and develop their language skills, they continue their readings in Hebrew.
