The History of Art major explores the historical significance of the world's greatest achievements in artistic production from pre-historic times to the present moment. Students learn to assess works of art in terms of their formal logic and aesthetic value as well as to comprehend art's broader cultural and ideological import. Although the History of Art major at OSU is designed to familiarize students with a broad array of historically and geographically diverse works of art in a range of media (painting, sculpture, architecture, prints, photography, video and film), the program also allows for concentrated study in particular areas of interest. Students are thereby prepared to undertake post-graduate work in the history of art and related disciplines.
