International business is the study of business transactions that cross national boundaries. It includes the study of international trade in tangible and intangible goods and commodities; the study of banking, insurance, marketing, and other international service transactions; and the analysis of direct and portfolio investments made outside the domestic market. Ancillary topics such as economic growth and development and ethics in international business are also generally covered. Transactions of both private and public entities are studied with a special focus on the operations of multinational corporations. International business involves all functional business areas and explores how these functions are impacted by expanding beyond the national arena. Particular emphasis is placed on the challenges presented by different sociocultural, political, and economic environments. [†] Due to the nature of International Business, students typically begin their careers in other functional areas of business.
