Medical laboratory scientists, also called clinical laboratory scientists, work in all areas of the medical laboratory including blood banking, immunology, chemistry, hematology, and microbiology. They perform a full range of laboratory tests including complex tests that detect cancer, HIV/AIDS, diabetes, and other diseases. They are also responsible for confirming the accuracy of test results and reporting laboratory findings to pathologists, physicians, nurses, and other health care professionals. The work of the medical laboratory scientist is so critical to the practice of modern medicine that it would be virtually impossible to provide good medical care without them.ⁱ
